

Scheme Policy and Design

Scheme Policy and Design provides students with an overview of the history of accident compensation schemes, along with critical analysis of the current situation around Australia and internationally. The unit considers the political issues surrounding the development of scheme design and policy and the impacts these decisions may have on other related bodies.

The objective of the unit is to help students to understand the rationale for statutory schemes and to better equip students to diagnose causes of scheme dysfunction or underperformance requiring legislative remedies and allow for more effective participation in the necessary process to implement change.

Who should study Scheme Policy and Design?

The subject would be particularly suitable for anyone interested in learning more about scheme design across Australia, New Zealand and beyond, with a view to improving their ability to operate in and influence the success of compensation scheme design.

Scheme Policy and Design is part of the first year of Master of Management (Personal Injury) and Master of Business (Personal Injury). It can also be undertaken as professional development, meaning that a student can enrol in a single, stand-alone unit (including the residential component) but not requiring an enrolment into the whole Masters course.

What is involved?

Scheme Policy and Design will be studied in Trimester 2, commencing 11 July 2011. As with all distance units, pre-reading and group work is required in order to effectively participate in a group assignment at the residential, as well as being necessary for the completion of an individual assignment.

Assessment requirements: 2500-word individual assignment 30%, contribution to online discussion 10%, 5500-word group assignment 40%, presentation of group assignment 20%.

The three-day residential is a compulsory part of the unit and allows the opportunity for intensive, concentrated study and a chance for networking and peer group learning. The residential component will run from Sunday 11 September to Wednesday 14 September 2011, at Deakin Management Centre in Geelong.
